2. Possible Group 6 league structure in 2025

3. <u>League Rule Changes</u>

The league secretary will present a rule change at the AGM regarding teams only playing with 3 players

4. <u>Representative Game Venues</u>

The Secretary expressed concern about the greens at Prittlewell BC and Bournemouth $\operatorname{Park}\,\operatorname{BC}$

The officers agreed to review the Prittlewell green at the beginning of next season and make a decision about it being the venue for next seasons Wally Ball games.

• Ashford Cup proposal from Group 4

Change Ashford Cup play-on dates to fortnightly rather than weekly from 2025

- Rejected by the delegates
- Wally Ball proposal from County President

Current County rule states that players who play in the Eastern Counties league are not eligible to play in the Wally Ball and Middleton Cup the following season.

Proposal to change rule to allow players who play in the Eastern Counties league to play in the Wally Ball and Middleton Cup for two seasons before being not eligible.

Alternative proposal from Group 6 that players who play in the Eastern Counties league can play in the Wally Ball and Middleton Cup the same year and future years. - Agreed by the delegates

• Carreras BC leaving Group 6
